1. Introductions and Roll: Dr. Holt opened the meeting by welcoming all members and guests.
2. Treasurer's Report: Carlton Holt provided the following table documents:

Discussion:

Dr. Holt presented the Treasurer's report and led a discussion about membership status and new board members from missing institutions. The available balance is \$6,823.61

3. ADE Presentation on recent events with SLLA scores - Beverly Williams & Ron Tolson

Discussion:

Initial license is for three (3) years and you do not have to take the SLLA test. However, when you apply for the Standard license you must turn in the present version of the test score or the previous version if within the three years. This could be a problem for graduates that continue to teach for several years, but take the test while the program is

"fresh in their minds" from academic classes and internship.

Also, under the Ethical Rules - there is a new step in the investigation. When the

"Summary of Findings" is given to individual, they would have 14 days to respond to the findings.

4. Committee Reports from Mitch Holifield and Kieth Williams

Leadership Coordinating Group - developing a plan for principal evaluation piece, but it is closely tied to the ISLLC Standards plus 1 from ADE.

CCSO - the common core teacher standards are tied to the ISLLC Standards

Also, looking into the expansion of School Board in-service requirements.

Finally, talk of dropping the 4 year teacher requirement back to 3 years for the principalship:

3 states have 5 years

1 state has 4 years (Arkansas)

21 states have 3 years

7 states have 2 years

3 states have 0 years

Dr. Bang made a motion to adjourn the meeting; Dr. Lang seconded; the motion to adjourn was carried. Dr. Holt adjourned the meeting.
